WATER SHUT OFF
Harvard Avenue – Water Line Work

STEUBENVILLE - The City of Steubenville will move into the next phase of the waterline work part of the 2014 City Street Hot-Mix Resurfacing Improvement / Harvard Avenue Waterline Replacement Project.

On Thursday, October 2, 2014 at 8:30 A.M. the contractor will make the major water main tie-in connection on Harvard Avenue. The water will be shut off and the affected water customers on the 200 Block of Harvard Avenue and the water customers on Cunningham Drive; as well as, water customers on the south side of Sunset Blvd from Yale Place to Cunningham Drive may experience low to no water during the hours of 8:30 A.M. and water is anticipated to be turn back on by 2:30 P.M.

On Friday, October 3, 2014 at 8:30 A.M. the contractor will make the another major water main tie-in connection on Harvard Avenue. The water will be shut off and the affected water customers on Sharmont Avenue, Parkdale Road and Yale Place may experience low to no water during the hours of 8:30 A.M. and water is anticipated to be turn back on by 2:30 P.M.
