SUBJECT: Buena Vista Blvd Extension Waterline Replacement Project

STEUBENVILLE – On Monday, April 6, 2015 at 7:00 A.M. the City of Steubenville started construction on the Buena Vista Blvd Extension Waterline Replacement Project. The work involves installing 2000 L.F. of 6" waterline including 30 service connections and 4 new Fire Hydrants.

Due to the condition of the existing 1 inch watermain, water may be periodically shutdown to expedite the construction of the project. The shutdowns will occur between 8:30 A.M. and 5:00 P.M. Monday through Friday.

During this project local access will be maintained, however motorists should allow extra time for their travels due to possible construction delays.

The project street will be posted "NO PARKING" at least one day in advance. If vehicles are left on the street, vehicles will be towed and owners will be responsible for towing and storage fees. We apologize for any inconvenience.

The City has contracted with S.E.T., Inc. of Lowellville, Ohio to do this project and is funded using the City Water Infrastructure Fund, the Ohio Appalachia Regional Commission (ARC) Fund and the Ohio Public Works Commission Funds.

The project is anticipated to be completed by late June 2015.
