SUBJECT: Valve Replacement Project – Downtown Market Street Traffic Advisory

STEUBENVILLE – Wednesday November 20, 2019 starting at 7am and continuing until completed, the Water Department and contractors will have **westbound traffic on Market Street from 4th Street to Commercial Alley closed to thru traffic and Commercial Alley from Market Street to the dollar tree parking lot side entrance closed.** These closures are needed to remove a leaking 12 inch valve on Market Street and to remove a non-functioning 6 inch valve on N. Commercial alley. The water will be shut off once excavations are completed and valves are ready to be removed. A Boil Advisory will be issue once work is complete for the 400 and 500 blocks of Market Street. This work is part of the Valve and Waterline Replacement Phase I and Phase II Project.

Due to the complexity of the Valve Replacement Project all residents in these areas may experience water quality issues such as Loss of Water, Low Water Pressure, or Water Discoloration. If you experience any of these conditions residents are asked to report the condition to the Water Filtration Plant at 740-283-6041.

We thank the residents of Steubenville for their patience and understanding throughout this very important project as we work to improve our Water System.
