

**MINUTES OF COUNCIL MEETING**  
**July 11, 2017**

The Regular Meeting/Public Hearing of City Council was called to order at 7:30 p.m. with Mayor Mucci presiding. The meeting was opened with a silent prayer followed by the Pledge of Allegiance. Present were Councilmen Paul, Timmons, Villamagna, DiLoreto, Dressel, Hahn, & Johnson.

Also present; City Manager James Mavromatis, Acting Law Director Costa Mastros, Parks and Recreation Director Lorri Fetherolf, Police Chief Bill McCafferty, Fire Chief Carlo Capaldi, Wastewater Supervisor Chuck Murphy, Dave Gossett from the Herald Star, & WTOV9.

**APPROVAL/CORRECTION OF MINUTES**

Minutes were approved by Mrs. Hahn for July 5, 2017. Second by Mr. Timmons. Roll Call. All ayes. So moved minutes accepted declared Mayor Mucci.

**PETITIONS/COMMUNICATIONS**

Mayor Mucci – “Madame Clerk is there any petitions in communications?”

Mrs. Haley – “I have nothing your Honor.”

Mayor Mucci – “Before we move into the Ordinances and Resolutions; we did have a notice go out for a Public Hearing that would be scheduled this evening for the 2018 Tax Budget. At this time we will open up the Public Hearing for the Tax Budget; I don’t see our Finance Director here; Mr. Paul do you have any reports on the matter?”

Mr. Paul – “No but I know; I called Dave today; I think his wife is getting that procedure done. This is the one that we present to the Jefferson County; I have nothing Dave didn’t forward anything to me your Honor.”

Mayor Mucci – “Well this evening city council will be considering Ordinance No. 2017-53 and that is our Tax Budget for the year 2018; so we will have public comments under that also. But is there anyone here wishing to speak on the Tax Budget? This is a Public Hearing; if not we will close the Public Hearing and we move into the Ordinances and Resolutions before City Council this evening.”

**ORDINANCES AND RESOLUTIONS**

**NO. 2017-53 – BY THE FINANCE COMMITTEE**

**Messrs. Paul, Johnson, Dressel**

**AN ORDINANCE ADOPTING A TAX BUDGET FOR THE FISCAL YEAR 2018 FOR THE CITY OF STEUBENVILLE, OHIO PROVIDING FOR A PUBLIC HEARING THEREON, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.**

Mayor Mucci – “You have heard the reading of Ordinance No. 2017-53. If there is anyone wishing to speak on Ordinance No. 2017-53 please come forward and state your name and address.”

Mr. Paul called question. Roll call. All ayes. Ordinance No. 2017-53 duly adopted declared Mayor Mucci.

Mayor Mucci – “I will sign the Ordinance this evening and it will go into effect immediately; it can be forward to the County to meet the deadline; however the clerk will need to provide a certified copy of the minutes to be attached with this that we had the Public Hearing as required by law.”

**NO. 2017-55 – BY THE FINANCE COMMITTEE**

**Messrs. Paul, Johnson, Dressel**

**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 2016-113, THE EXISTING TABLE OF ORGANIZATION OF THE CITY OF STEUBENVILLE AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.**

Mayor Mucci – “You have heard the reading of Ordinance No. 2017-55. If there is anyone wishing to speak on Ordinance No. 2017-55 please come forward and state your name and address.”

Mr. Johnson – “Yes I believe that we did not have this is our possession 72 hours so I think we need to make the motion to waive that rule.”

Mayor Mucci – “You didn’t have it.”

Mr. Johnson – “No I don’t believe that we did; did we?”

Mayor Mucci – “Yes you are correct; point well taken Mr. Johnson.”

Mr. Johnson – “So I would like to make the motion to suspend the rule requiring that the Council and the Mayor have the legislation in their hand 72 hours before it is read.” Seconded by Mr. DiLoreto. Roll call. All ayes. So moved. Rule suspended declared Mayor Mucci.

Mayor Mucci – “Thank you Mr. Johnson for calling that to our attention. Now that the house is in order and the rules our suspended we can act upon Ordinance No. 2017-55; public comments were called upon; none hearing; council?”

Mr. Paul called question. Roll call. All ayes. Ordinance No. 2017-55 duly adopted declared Mayor Mucci.

**REPORT OF COMMITTEES**

Mr. Paul – “Yes your Honor; I have an Ordinance by the Finance Committee; it’s an Ordinance authorizing the City Manager and or the Finance Director to advertise for bid for hospitalization, medical surgical benefits, and

major medical benefits for the officers and employees of the City of Steubenville subject to the right to reject any and all bids and authorizing the entry into a contract upon the approval of the lowest invested and declaring an emergency. Hopefully we can get another provider. Secondly I just want to remind everybody; next Tuesday July 18<sup>th</sup> at six o'clock we will have the Safety Committee meeting and we're going to have the EPA representative here; hopefully Mr. Baird is going to provide that person and we'll discuss the feasibility of the compactor and the transfer station; that's next Tuesday at six o'clock. Tomorrow I want to remind everybody we have a Rec Board Committee meeting at the clubhouse at seven o'clock; last week I brought up about naming a couple fields one after Fleetwood Moses Walker and another one after Rich Donnelly; I would like some more input at the Recreation Board meeting and I asked Lorri Fetherolf to put that on the agenda for us tomorrow so we'll discuss that tomorrow at the Recreation Board meeting and the next one I'm going to bring up; cause I said I called Dave's office today and his wife is having a procedure done; he's off until the 24<sup>th</sup> of July which is a Monday; I'm going to call a Finance Committee meeting for 25<sup>th</sup>; I'm pretty sure he'll have all the finance and everything together; if he can't make it we can always cancel it but I'll call that for 6:30; just so we see where our finances are heading; I know we got a little concern in some areas and I would just like to call that for 6:30 on the 25<sup>th</sup>. Like I said if we have too we can always cancel it; I'm not sure how things are going with Dave and his wife but my prayers are with them."

Mr. Timmons – No report

Mr. Villamagna – "Mayor only one thing I'd like to comment on the roundabout now that it's opened; it seems to be doing what it was supposed to do; get the traffic flowing through there and I've been through it several times; I sat in Saint Steven's Church and I watched it; as everybody knows in here I was opposed to it but it looks nice and it seems to be doing the job so kudos to Mr. Dolak and to the citizens for putting up with the hardship on Lovers Lane and Bryden Road; those citizens in both areas have put up with a lot during the construction of that roundabout; there were some complaints but most of the people were compliant and understood."

Mayor Mucci – "Thank you Mr. Villamagna and I know our City Manager is going to make remarks about some of the road projects that are going on; I too had the opportunity to go through the roundabout on a couple of occasions unfortunately going to Mosti's funeral home; I've been there so much lately; but it looks like people are adapting to it; it still takes time; I hope our citizens understand the full impact of let alone that particular project but also the Lawson Bridge project; when we take in some federal dollars and state dollars to accomplish the infrastructure within our community. Talking about the roundabout on Lovers Lane as you well know; not quite but in the middle of Lovers Lane and for so long we have been searching for other sources to help us to approve the rest of Lovers Lane; from one end to the other end and they know what we're doing on the front end on the intersection; now we got the middle part; but I have a feeling and this happens quite a bit in government that once the state and federal agency starts investing money in an area they want that area to be successful and grow so I would imagine that future grants to help us accomplish from one end of Lovers Lane to the other end; funding will come a lot easier; at least they would look at it because there's already an investment in that area."

Mr. DiLoreto – "First of all I would say thank you to Mr. Dolak; we got a guardrail on Lincoln Heights that's all completed; it took me five (5) years but it's finally completed; I see that JB Green Team is reducing taxes so before they (inaudible) I would like to request that we have another day where we can collect tires and electronics; it was a huge success and my (inaudible) are starting to gather in the first ward. Judge Mascio Jr. send his thanks for the support of this Council for instituting (inaudible) back to community service; he'll be back to work tomorrow; so if anyone has any request please see Julie and he'll take care of them as soon as possible. I think the first thing on his agenda; Willie Paul he's going down to the Marina and try to get that place cleaned up; so we're getting our dollar worth. Thank you."

Mr. Dressel – No report

Mrs. Hahn – "Okay so we have the next volunteer time for anybody who wants to work on the landscaping at the pool so this Thursday the 13<sup>th</sup>; we're going to be there from 3:00 – 7:00 p.m. It would help me to plan if I know that you're coming because some people have begun to volunteer; collecting some of their own plants and donating them; what we don't want is to have bags or boxes that we can't get into the ground because we don't have enough help to put it in the ground. I don't know is that the kind of thing that Julie could help us with? Just a hand full of people at the end of the day. Do you know? For like four (4) or five (5)?"

Mr. DiLoreto – "Yea you can just ask her or I'll ask her."

Mr. Mavromatis – "It does involve transportation and most of them work during the daytime; from 9-5."

Mrs. Hahn – "Well even if we did 4-5 just with them; that would be really helpful. Anyway it would be great if you brought your own shovel and gloves and a bottle of water. It's going well and I hope you're seeing improvement. Thank you."

Mr. Johnson – "Yes your Honor; I would like to finalize the walking tour of Pleasant Heights; we can do it in the afternoon; it would start at 1:30 p.m. either doing it on the 24<sup>th</sup>, the 31<sup>st</sup>, or the first Monday in August; which is either the 7<sup>th</sup> or the 6<sup>th</sup>; what's good for you guys? Eric says the 31<sup>st</sup> or the first one in August does anybody else have a preference? Let's do it the 31<sup>st</sup> at 1:30."

Mr. Villamagna – "That's a Monday Mike?"

Mr. Johnson – "That is a Monday."

Mr. Dressel – "Where are we meeting?"

Mr. Johnson – "Let's meet at McKinley school to start off. I want to thank Mike Dolak and his office and the contractors for the replacement of Lawson Ave. Bridge; it looks great; the Steubenville on the side looks great;

I've gotten a lot of comments all positive about the condition of the bridge and how it looks; it's a great addition to the city." (Walking tour was changed after the council meeting to August 14<sup>th</sup> at 1:30 p.m.)

Mayor Mucci – "The clerk will facilitate the proper notice for the Walking Tour on Pleasant Heights; meeting place will be at McKinley School at 1:30 on July 31<sup>st</sup>." (Date changed) Before we move onto the report of administrative officers I would just like to inform Council that I believe it was about 2-3 weeks ago a suggestion was giving out that the City of Wheeling placed a blue line in front of their City Building the Police Department to show support for the Wheeling Police Department and it was suggested by Mr. Barilla that we do it here in front of our building. Mr. Barilla has informed me that we put all the ingredients together to make that happen; not this coming Wednesday but the following Wednesday in the evening hours; Mr. Roger Hilty has agreed to use his equipment; he did the lines in the parking lot for the fort; but to do the blue line down the middle of the two (2) yellow lines to show our support for the Steubenville Police Department; so that activity will be happening next Wednesday; I'm just informing Council I already told them to move forward with the particular project; there will be no assistance necessary from the city; they have the cones, they have the paint, which is being purchased from I believe M & M Hardware; Mr. Hilty is providing that also along with the labor and the equipment to put down that blue line; so I want to thank you Mr. Hilty for allowing that to happen within our community. Thank you very much."

## **REPORT OF ADMINISTRATIVE OFFICERS**

Mr. Mavromatis – "Thank you Mayor. Based on Mr. Villamagna's request council should've had in their box a weekly report to assist them on what our respectable department heads have done; again what I would ask you to do; read this; if you have any questions or things you would think more you would like to have then send me an e-mail so I can make sure that we can adjust this; it's a learning process because I have 7-8 different minds here think different; just tell me what would help you cause all of your constituents are different they are not always on the same sheet of page here. Chief was the addition put in there? Alright I'll see that they get a copy. For the police department one thing I did ask was in the weeks' time; how many actually calls or reports did we do in that weeks' time? It was 826; I'll make sure you get a copy; Yonk I will give you this so you have a copy and the rest I will have scanned and sent out; but what it is 826 reports during that weeks' time; Mr. Villamagna will know when he sees it; for the rest of the council if some of these you do not understand what they are then ask and we will get you an answer for it. It gives you an idea; what it averages out is 168 hours; that 4.91 calls per hour; now some calls are done within 2-3 minutes others may be several hours but it gives you an idea also based on the manpower that we had based on the shifts; now clearly on midnight shift at eight in the morning; you go three or four in the morning you're not going to have a lot of calls so they are out on patrol they are looking for things like they should be but this gives you an idea at least from the Police Department. Chief Capaldi this may be something you may get from the Fire Department; it can give them an idea on the type of calls that our Fire Department respond too; that gives them an idea of when they're out what type of calls they respond too. Mr. Johnson the keys have been issued to the Police Department for the bathrooms; the only one that has not because it takes a special master key at Belleview Park but the rest of the parks every car; five (5) sets were given to the Police Department and also the instruction that when they go to lock them; they're to look in to see what the condition is; if they are torn apart or damaged they will take the proper photographs and make a report on it so again we can see what we are dealing with in this city as far as the maintenance and how they take care of our restrooms."

Mr. Johnson – "I appreciate it that. They're starting this week?"

Mr. Mavromatis – "Yes; the keys were issued tonight."

Mr. Johnson – "Thank you."

Mr. Mavromatis – "For Judge Mascio; our municipal court; he's applied again for a grant for the State of Ohio. This is no cost to the city and this is to maintain our court probation department; so I have to sign off on the document; it's for a grant of \$144,000.00 so I wanted Council to know this; it's the same grant that we had last year the only thing at this time is the State said they would change it during the year which is \$20,000.00 short than last year but they will be the proper amendment as they get the funding for it; again I wanted Council to be aware of this; it's no cost to the city and this will benefit us here. While we're on this here we also have another project; this will probably be the third one that we have worked in partnership with the County. The first one which I was not here had to deal with the wireless service; the fiber lines that were hooked up; this will require a fiber line coming in to this courtroom here; what is going to happen is this will be a video arraignment that we are finally going to get; this will help us as a city; that I can cut back on the police for transporting prisoners over here for arraignment it'll free them up to go on patrol which is what they should be doing but again our cost for us what is coming here is roughly \$10,573.00. What you would see in here there will be a monitor set up here where Mayor Mucci is sitting where the actually video of the Judge will go over to the County Jail. There will be two (2) monitors here; 65 inch screens; one will be in the back so the audience can focus on that the other will be placed here so if there is a trial and there's things they need to use; they want to use a power point; whatever for testimony it will face the attorneys here and everybody here. What we are trying to do is modernize our courtroom here and this video arraignment is going across the nation; this will make things a lot safer for one and again save us on man hours and people from moving and shuttling prisoners back and forth; and this will work (inaudible) with our common pleas court. Saturday my wife and I went over to the Greek Festival in Weirton; I have several people come up to me about two (2) things; one (1) our roundabout; I was not here when it was approved and I can tell you what probably is the biggest concerns is a lot of people don't understand; when there is grant money; there's a lot of grant money that comes in for specific things and this

was very specific for a roundabout with a 100% financing. Now is that the absolute best thing to have there; maybe, maybe not; I've had the chance to spend time watching this; I can pull it up on my computer; I've watched people drive around it three (3) or four (4) times just to see how it works. It is very simple it's completely new here; absolutely was it a discomfort to the residents there absolutely but not just on Lovers Lane; Bryden Road took a beating and what I mean by that the volume of speeders; our police were out there, we had speed control apparatuses out there to give us an idea; just so you understand 71 mph was the highest speeding vehicle or motorcycle; we believe it was a motorcycle based on the time of day that it was clocked. This has been a discomfort for the whole area out there but when you sit and look at it and you see the comments from people it was well worth it. The other is the Lawson Ave. bridge; it would've been nice if we could've had the lettering on both sides but based on the design of the bridge it was only possible on the one thing so again people going into downtown; it's a nice view; I've had a lot of comments on it and again just in general to the citizens on LaBelle to the citizens on Pleasant Heights; it was absolutely a disruption but now it's open. Any construction that you have that disrupts the neighborhood or a major straight it is frustrating; you're either going to take progress and move ahead or you're going to stay right where you're at; so you have to look ahead; deal with the inconvenience and you will see that. I think we're going to see more comments; I think this opens up a lot of eyes of people going to the mall with Rural King being there because it attracts a lot of people outside of our area; there will be more coming into there. I've been in numerous conversations with our attorney and Columbus and this has to deal with our insurance; this is a very high priority with me because this is something that we have to pay attention too only because at some point we could possibly be liable up to \$800,000.00 to 1.2 million; I'm not saying that's where we're going to end up but this is why this is a paramount importance. Monday we are having a cost containment committee meeting where we will brief them on everything so they exactly; right now we have the same insurance coverage that they had before; the same administrator; we just don't have the plan provider we pulled away from that; that's clearly where the problems were and we're dealing with that. To the citizens up on Lovers Lane and Braybarton I appreciate your patience' I'm well aware of the problems out there I've talked to numerous citizens out there; they understand but they don't have to like it but now that it's open everybody's is all smiles; there maybe one (1) or two (2) on Lovers Lane but again some of their property had to be taken (inaudible) road which is our right-a-way which they were compensated for. This is where we're at and we're moving forward again I have a couple reports. Mayor I'd like to have my Department Heads speak."

Chuck Murphy – "Yes there has been request for information regards to porta potty septic; why we do or do not take the material and essentially what it will rules down too is there is a blue liquid in there that is a biocide; it literally kills bacteria; our wastewater treatment plant is based on as far as its performance; the use of bacteria, good bacteria to go ahead and achieve water quality standards to meet the EPA rules and regulations; that is the one/first concern that we have. If that biocide is not expended it gets in there it can go head and kill off the good bacteria in our plant and potentially put us in violation. The other thing that I am concerned about is there are going to be rocks and things of that nature; our head works is not exactly the greatest in the world and that's an understatement; you have a five (5) inch opening at the head coming into the plant a lot of things fit through that especially rock and things of that nature that is sucked up by the septic (inaudible) things of that nature; then you go ahead and end up normally sitting where you drop it; right at the head of the plant; then when you get the rain to come in you're going to get an indentation of all that material coming in and jam up our rig system and potentially break it like it's happened before (inaudible) way back when. So you have to be very careful with these things and that's the only reason why (inaudible) have not accepted it is because we are not capable of taking (inaudible) if we were I would've done it in a heartbeat. There is one enemy that is getting material from a gas and oil company where they have workers and trailers and I've been in discussion with those folks and they are not using the biocide and because all of their stuff is true household waste and just going into a holding tank; that I wouldn't have a problem with because it's not going to cause the same issues. I told them; we have gone ahead and put forward a (inaudible) and to date I haven't heard back; I was going to check with him here to see exactly where they stand and what they want to do. In addition to this; I'm trying to go ahead and look and see if there is anything new since the last three (3) or four (4) years when I first looked at this; to see if there anything new in terms of being able to deal with the biocide; being able to go ahead and somehow kill that off however the case may be without it costing the city a fortune to build it; because whatever we do we don't want to go ahead and get into this only to end up spending a good deal of money cause you're looking at for a septic and receiving station which is what you need to do it; a minimum of a hundred thousand and could go well more than a million. I've talked to many different operators across the state; from different conferences and things of that nature and essentially what it comes down to is if you're not properly set up for this it can go ahead and mess up your system pretty good; then it will cost you much more than it's worth. Problem is; is when (inaudible) demand (inaudible) material so it's not like you're going to get mass quantities of material coming in to your facility and you're going to make a ton of money; you'll get a little bit of money and that's a good thing but we want to make sure that we do it in a responsible manner and not (inaudible) that the bill is going to hurt us cause that end I was speaking to a individual basically about whether or not what the cost was for the septic receiving system and in that process he may of mentioned something that I wasn't aware of is how EPA wants septic to come to the wastewater treatment facility so they don't dump it some place they shouldn't so they're willing to go ahead and give money on that so he's been checking into it; I'm going to check into it and if they can (inaudible) with and ask if that money is available to us and we can deal with the aspect of the biocide then great yeah; let's go ahead and sign up; that's free money that's basically no harm to us (inaudible). So that's basically where we are at in regards to anything we take in we want to test first and

make sure that there are (inaudible) that can hurt us because the (inaudible) concern would be nitrogen ammonia; I know that Councilman Villamagna and Councilman Johnson were there when you guys first started and we were taking (inaudible) and there was a nitrogen ammonia level spike and it was starting to cause some issues we took it down (inaudible) because it was way too high. We don't want to go back to that and put ourselves in potential violation situation (inaudible!) and we don't want to start now. The other thing that I got here; I'll keep the City Manager and Council (inaudible) progress on this; (inaudible) information to see if we can; based on the latest information. The water department in terms of our trucks; the big problem we have is our trucks our fifteen (15) plus years old; extremely poor condition and we can no longer get parts; as a matter of fact Steubenville trucks had a great deal of trouble being able to just get used parts; (inaudible) to fight to get them; that being said it puts us in a very difficult situation in terms of being able to perform (inaudible) street openings, water line repairs and things of that nature; now we are going ahead and trying to make due by going ahead and taking wastewater trucks utilizing it to go ahead and (inaudible) diminishing the capabilities of the wastewater department to get their work done as well; so we need to get a new truck is really what we need to do here. I checked in; I actually try to get state purchasing pricing I was looking at getting one earlier this year unfortunately the money I had put into the budget to do so; we ended up having to use it for 7<sup>th</sup> Street with all the stuff that's going on there with all those repairs. We would end up having to go ahead and go into the water reserve in order to go ahead (all inaudible). I know that right now I haven't spoken with those (inaudible) contract; they've told me that the state contract currently is up for bid again; ODOT will have to bid for trucks; can't go to the state purchasing until this is done until August or September; that can go ahead and create a rather sticky situation considering line breaks and various other work that needs to be done to go ahead and deal with these issues; so anyhow the same gentleman has stated that they had a truck coming in that they can match the bid that's there; that will shorten the time table because even if we were to order a brand new one today it will take three (3) months. He's going to give me a price on it tomorrow; my recommendation is that we go ahead and once we have that number proceed forward because it is what we were looking at in the first place by chance; so we can go ahead and end up getting ourselves (inaudible) full fashion for the citizens of the City of Steubenville. It would have to be done in some emergency bases to keep us a float as quickly as possible."

Mayor Mucci – "Thank you Mr. Murphy and the cost of that?"

Chuck Murphy – "As far as things are concerned all that I can give you for right now would actually be the list price is because the final price I won't know until tomorrow and the list price that you are looking at is about \$145,000.00."

Mayor Mucci – "And since we have to move with this rather immediately and it could possible take emergency legislation; is there any way that we can sunshine the legislation tonight even if it's not ready for next Tuesday it can be ready for the following Tuesday?"

Mr. Mavromatis – "Mayor; I would ask to let me confirm with Dave Lewis because I want to see exactly where we can pull the money from or where we have too; so Council can be properly briefed on it."

Mr. Mastro – "Mayor just so Council knows; we would be going under a different code section than we normally would in terms of emergency legislation; I had an opportunity to talk to Mr. Murphy we are going to have to utilize 735.051 because there is obviously since it's over a certain dollar amount; you would have to bid it out if there is a code section which would allow us under a real (inaudible) emergency when you connect with the operations of the maintenance of the department to forego the whole bidding requirements; 2/3 of the legislative authority would have to agree and it can be passed as an emergency and that does not have to be bid out formally so we would be doing that as an emergency so I'll get with Mr. Murphy as well regarding the be present and real emergency and then Mr. Mavromatis can get with Mr. Lewis for the current financing; probably at the least two (2) meetings from now."

Mayor Mucci – "And that section will appear in the ordinance?"

Mr. Mastro – "Yes it will."

Mr. Villamagna – "Chuck I want to thank you for the problem that we had today that I talked to you about and the citizen was very happy with the way you handled it and the conversation that we had; very courteous and helpful."

Lorri Fetherolf – "So just an update on the pool and how things are going; we have been closed for several days because of the rain; today we had 37 people out there today; I will say we had a donation and Mrs. Hahn bought some colorful chairs for out there which helped out a lot because I like to sit next to the lounge chair. We have three (3) party rentals next three (3) Saturdays out there; I have youth works coming out tomorrow morning to help me do some clean up, the grass needs cut if it dries out; the second level of the clubhouse; that back towards the pool needs cleaned out, the bushes need trimmed they're going to do that and Franciscan has adopted Belleview Park; they will be coming out on the 19<sup>th</sup>; what they do is they have there is their instructors can get paid time off to come out and do some stuff for us; so anytime I can get some free work out there I'm happy about that.
