STEUBENVILLE - On Saturday, August 25, 2018 at 7:00 AM; weather permitting. The Contractor will begin placing the new hot-mix asphalt surface course on Laretta Drive. Motorists are advised to allow extra time during travel for the periodically stopping and/or detouring of traffic. Motorists should use alternate routes to avoid delays.

The Project Street will be posted "NO PARKING" at least one day in advance. If vehicles are left on the street, vehicles will be towed and owners will be responsible for towing and storage fees. We apologize for any inconvenience.

The Project Street for this phase of the project is as follows:

East Half of Laretta Drive from John Scott Hwy to Garfield Avenue
