SUBJECT: **2019 Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Street Resurfacing Improvements**

STEUBENVILLE – The City of Steubenville will begin the 2019 Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Street Resurfacing Improvement Program starting Monday, May 6, 2019 at 7:00 A.M. and continue daily throughout the week; weather permitting. The initial work will involve the removal of the existing asphalt surface using a cold milling process. Traffic will be maintained, with periodic lane restrictions. Motorists are advised to use alternate routes to avoid delays. After preparation, a hot-mix asphalt intermediate course will be placed.

The Project Streets will be posted "NO PARKING" at least one day in advance. If vehicles are left on the street, vehicles will be towed and owners will be responsible for towing and storage fees. We apologize for any inconvenience.

Streets included in this phase of the operation will be:

Slack Street	from	South 3RD Street	to	Hill Avenue
Wells Street	from	Slack Street	to	State Route 7
North 5TH Street	from	Washington Street	to	Market Street

The City has contracted with Shelly & Sands, Inc. of Rayland, Ohio to do this project and is funded using Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) provided by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD).
