**REPORT OF COMMITTEES**

Mr. Petrella – No Report

Mr. Timmons – No Report

Mr. Villamagna – “Yes Mayor I just have one thing. There was a webinar held today at the Fort which I know that you are aware of in regarding Federal Government stimulus. I was in contact with the City Manager after the webinar to discuss its content and it’s to my understanding that nothing is definite about how the money is allowed to be used. Our share is 15.9 million dollars; that’s unbelievable and it’s my hope that the money can be used on our water infrastructure and sewer; maybe we will be able to lower our water rates or at least stop the increase for a couple years. I don’t know just maybe. What I am going to do is when the City Manager and Finance Director along with our auditors have gone through the bill and can advise us on how it can be spent; I’m sure it’s going to take some time the bill is over 600 pages. I’d like to call a special meeting of Council to discuss the expenditures with Jim, Dave, and all the Department Heads for input. I’m so grateful for the City to be receiving this money. We should be able to accomplish a lot I just can’t believe we got that amount of

money.” Mr. Villamagna also sun shined a resolution designating the month of April 2021 as Fair Housing Month in the City of Steubenville. Second by Mr. Paul.

Mrs. Anyabwile – “I just have a report on researching the Facebook issue we talked about last week and how Bob said if there was one without comments that he would be for it. Well actually you can set up a Facebook page without comments however since we’re a public entity it could be a violation of the First Amendment so that’s one of the reasons why it can’t be set up without comments. There are alternatives one is that we set it up and that the comments can be deleted however they can be saved because if it ever came down that the city needed to have those comments in case of a lawsuit or something that those comments could be saved in a file and companies are set up to do that. I’m just saying that. So I checked with other websites from other cities and I’m sure that we’re not the only city in the United States that has negative feedback from its constituents. Some of the Facebook pages of their cities actually have a Facebook they even have Twitter. Once city I checked even had the button on it where they welcome the public comment. I was just saying I’m pretty sure other cities have folks who have inappropriate comments and somehow I think they manage to deal with it. I think the difference is that we have to be prepared to listen and willing to accept some of the comments and suggestions that can help us as a City Council and as a City in whole grow and that we do a better job in serving this community. City Employees should not be the only ones telling each other what a good job that we are doing. When I first ran for City Council the gentleman walked up to me in the mall and said you need your head examined. I didn’t even know this man and he said I needed to have my head examined to be on City Council. City Councils have had such a negative reputation you know I wanted to come on City Council because I wanted to help make a difference for the city. So I’m just saying you know sometimes the negative comments might even actually help us grow but definitely the positive comments are kind of a gage on what we are doing and we have to accept the negative and the positive. We have to learn not to take things personally but that we are here and we want the city to grow and that’s my comment.”

Mr. Villamagna – “Scott reminded me last week about a couple things that I actually forgot. The difference between a city Facebook and one that a person has which Scott has one and so does Eric and I don’t know if anyone has one; they have threaten physical violence on there and the difference is Scott can delete that from his page when they do that. The other thing is you mentioned a negative image of Council, a negative image of Council has come from social media not from our actions and I can take constructive criticism. After the meeting last week when we went home I got on WTOV’s Facebook and they are bashing me and Councilman Paul and he didn’t even say anything last week. They were bashing me and him that’s not criticism that’s mean spirited and it does nothing good for the city because other people read these comments. A guy asked me the other day why can’t anything happen here in Steubenville? And I said I’ll tell you why because your brother, who he has a brother who’s a big time contractor, goes around and when he goes into these meetings and tells people that you can’t work with the City of Steubenville; they’re horrible, they’re this they’re that; you have to grease palms, you have to do this and it’s just simply not true but when other people in a circle when you’re talking about millionaires hear those comments they take them as gospel truth. We’re here to conduct business this is not a social format here we are here to conduct business for the City the Steubenville. The negativity I can take the constructive criticism I’ve had people sit in that audience Dolores stuck up for me the very first meeting when a guy got up here and he said a couple bad things and I was new and I let it roll off my back and that guy came to me later and said I was sorry that I said it but he had his right you know he was worried about what I said and I’m okay with that. I’m not okay with people threatening, I’m not okay with being called names and I’m not okay with being accused. This Council we don’t always get along, we argue, we have disagreements I can’t name one person on this Council that has done anything negatively to impact the reputation of this city or this Council. I will never go on the Facebook. I don’t care what other cities are doing. I just read these comments that are on the Herald Star page and WTOV page and I can’t even; we’ve had people follow us, film us doing things because there’s nobody in here that’s perfect so we’re going to make a mistake. That’s my comment. The negative things that are brought up towards Council are created by false lies, innuendos, and social media. Social media is what it is social it’s to be on there and socialize. People have never come forward down here. They don’t come forward and bring anything relative. If you go and you look at these Facebook pages they’re from Westerville; I’m arguing with a guy when this first started and I found out that he was from San Diego, CA and he don’t live here and then I said to myself I’ll never put myself in this position again because I’m arguing with a guy from San Diego, CA. So that’s my comment about it.”

Mr. Dressel – “Okay I actually have something I wanted to say and I spoke to Asantewa earlier today about the ordinance that she’s introducing to repeal or change the way we run public forum and if you all know I sent out an email last week because actually I don’t think we should have to limit anyway but my comment was do we really need an ordinance with rules in it that are trying to enforce behavior as opposed to content when our Charter specifically says that we have to have a public forum and it’s; this is for even people who aren’t residents with the city because the residents are addressed separately. But it says Council shall provide any person or group at least 5 minutes before adjournment to speak on any matter pertinent to city affairs and then we have a Mayor with a gavel that can shut anybody up that he doesn’t want to talk. I know that’s hard to do but my only point was and I like hard as it is to believe I’m sort of hesitant to vote for this which those who have been here well; I find that surprising and the only reason is I’m not sure I want to convolute it by adding a bunch of rules around it. What I would rather do is just repeal the ordinance and go back to what the Charter says which is nice and clean and simple and the Mayor who runs this meeting and has the authority to stop anybody from talking even me right now can tell people what to do or not. So my only comment was maybe we should think about before next meeting on voting whether we just want to amend the ordinance to say we’re going to repeal the ordinance. I’m not telling anybody what to do but I just think adding more stuff on top of

where we are isn't going to make it easier except getting rid of the Friday registration requirement and then the rest of it is subjective so that's what I wanted to say. And then as far as Facebook goes I don't think the City should have a page either. I use to help run the page when they had a page and what a freaking nightmare that was. It was awful and Bob's right I mean it was absolutely terrible because it wasn't constructive it was destructive and we all know the water rates suck. I'm still being told that 300 thousand times a day however we are rebuilding our water system at a remarkable rate and we'll actually have; we have a good as hard as it is to believe. It's getting better every day and we have to put up with the criticism of that but I'll tell you what I wouldn't change my mind on the quotes that we took to make all that happen for anything because if we don't do it then the next Council can look back and blame this group for not having done it and we did it. So we had to do it and whether you like it or not people in this room were elected to do things that people aren't always going to like but it's for the betterment of the city. So the same thing with public forum if we're going to have do we just want a nice simple one or do we want one that's not simple. Thanks."

Mr. Villamagna – "Changing the public forum thing; you mentioned something else too that I liked you said that you brought up signing up at 1:00; was that you that brought it up on a Tuesday?"

Mr. Dressel – "Just something beforehand so that people will know that something was coming."

Mr. Villamagna – "Right. So I said if you did it at 1:00 on Tuesday that gives Jim or anybody where it's going to be directed to in the ward time to get it and the other thing is and Costa you correct me if I'm wrong that 5 minute thing we follow the law because we argued (all inaudible) people can sign up and talk about anything they want to talk about."

Mr. Mastros – "Right. Anybody. Anyone."

Mr. Villamagna – "So you say that's legal what we're doing?"

Mr. Mastros – "Yep. I mean we have to follow the Charter. Correct."

Mr. Villamagna – "Because I'm not averse to changing it but you was here when it was row after row."

Mr. Dressel – "Yeah."

Mr. Villamagna – "And to be honest the Mayor when that episode here with the one guy with the name calling and the swearing and everything he's banging the gavel saying okay you got to stop well it doesn't stop just like that. Chief or whatever cop is working in the corner he got to come and get the guy. Then there's another little parade going out the door like there was that night with the name calling and everything and I won't take it no more. I took it twice and you can get mad at me or throw me out of a meeting but I will not and I'm promising everybody this nobody is going to call me the names that I was called that night again without me saying something. So that's it. Thank you."

Mrs. Anyabwile – "So I did a meeting to come up the ordinance at least some talk has been generated about having people come and being able to speak it's supposed to be called public forum not sign up before and I do believe that isn't it against the ordinance that you have to have sign up? You should be able to come and speak. People should be allowed to speak. People should again be respectful there should not be name calling. There should not be arguing back and forth between the Council and the public at large. People need to as I say be grown up and respect one another. I came up with the rules to be able to say okay these are the things we need to follow maybe and as Scott and I were talking about it today maybe like with the Judge does he reads what needs to be done in his court room before court is in session so if the set of rules are you know are read then they might not have to be in the ordinance. One thing I do want to see though is if somebody asks a question and no one up here has the answer but we do or someone is able to get back with that person I did want to see that question repeated again in the next meeting and the answer because other people may have that same question. That question may have gotten answered for that person but there are other people who want that you know have that same subject on their mind and would want an answer would want some clarity. So I would still want to see us to be able to answer the public with the question that was brought maybe by one person but it could be more than one person wanting that answer. So I am for us altering and changing and getting out something that most of us or hopefully all of us can be agreeable on for public forum. I think it should be an open time for the public to come and address City Council because again we're supposed to be the ears and the voice of this city."

Mr. Mavromatis – "To give some comments to Council because I watch this and I understand the purpose of this just information for all of you. When we have someone that signs up for public forum and it's misinterpreted that we don't want people to speak. I don't care how many people sign up. You can have 50 people sign up they all have their 5 minutes so that's a misinterpretation that we're trying to stop people. What it has done is given me time and I don't mind adjusting the time of when you have to call but what I've been able to do is I see what they want to talk about; some of the things I need to get answers for them hadn't I known that ahead of time I'd be standing here and sitting here listening to them and I may not have the facts they need. It enabled me the time to contact my superintendents or my records that I need to go to so I called them on the phone and I recite it back to them what I found and I answered their question. Then I said now you're still entitled to come down to Council; you're still entitled to 5 minutes to speak and a lot of times they say they don't need to come down because you answered my questions you saved me a trip. And I do agree with you Asantewa there are questions that are asked by somebody that a lot of people have the same question and we need to get that out but there's nothing to stop me as I've said before I answered the person's question but I could take it a step further and say this was the question they had and this was the answer to it so it clearly gets it out there but the other thing is you're dealing with human beings some people just like to take the chance that they're going to be on the TV. We don't control that. They do. Some people like to be in the papers. I don't control that the lady over here controls that but the bottom line is I agree we should have a public forum. There's other cities that you must sign up to speak at Council and there's a reason for that to control who is

speaking and can we answer the questions they want and I've watched some of the people that have signed up, they stay on point for what they've initially signed up for and then they go into another area here. Which if we can answer the questions I'm all for it but the bottom line is it gives you better order for what you have here but I've yet to see where it stops anybody from not speaking at Council because I don't know anyone that I've talked to I've answered their questions and I have told them you are more than welcomed to come down and speak at your time. You have 5 minutes. They say there's no need. You've answered what I needed to know so I just wanted this information given to Council it has worked I think it has kept it more orderly but I don't think it's ever stopped anybody from not wanting to speak at Council."

Mr. Villamagna – "Jim since you brought that up because I forgot about two things. When I first got on Council and nobody was here besides Willie and Craig will know what I'm talking about because he was here prior you were only allowed to speak at every other meeting."

Mr. Mavromatis – "Yes that's correct. You had a sunshine meeting."

Mr. Villamagna – "And I brought that up that we should be allowed to speak at every meeting if there is registration and everything and the other thing is because we always talk about trying to stop people from talking. Mr. Paul stood up during that water crisis and he told everybody in that audience we have that you cannot talk without signing up and we are not going to go by that rule. Anybody that wants to talk about any of the water problems can get up and talk so nobody has ever tried to stop anybody from talking."

Mrs. Hahn – "Yeah. Under Parks and Recreation I don't have anything but I did get to see the economic development seminar today and that was helpful. The National League of Cities and it is a really strange opportunity for us, a wonderful opportunity but it is something really serious that we want to make sure we make very good decisions about and there may be an opportunity here to also be more aware of grants that come available so that we could even stretch the dollars further. So yeah we'll keep you posted there's so much they don't know. The money is supposed to be released no later than 90 days from passage but the Treasurer Department hasn't given an actual date yet and also has not released a kind of list of what would be appropriate for that. So anyway it was really instructive seminar."

Mr. Petrella – "On that same subject on both Mrs. Hahn and Mr. Villamagna's point once we get a list of; I do agree with Bob that you know this Council needs to meet and dissect it and come up with the ways because (all inaudible) did an excellent job with the last round of cares act and we spent almost done to the penny and with the amount of money you mentioned earlier Bob I'd like to do the same thing now whatever we can do for the city I mean you know this is not free money. Everybody says of the stimulus packages that's our tax dollars they are just giving back some of the money that we paid in so you know the stuff that the Government is giving you something they are not giving us anything that we have not already paid into."

Mrs. Hahn – "The interesting thing is we can tell everyone this for sure we can't just pay for normal budget items."

Mr. Petrella – "Right."

Mrs. Hahn – "So it's not about you know just automatically taking care of the budget for the year."

Mr. Petrella – "Right."

Mrs. Hahn – "But one of the things that has been so helpful and really Dave Lewis and his department and how they work with department heads over the years to come up with long range plans for capital funds; for capital improvements and so because so much work has already been thought about we're farther than a lot of municipalities I think for coming up with effective ways of using these funds. So it will really be interesting so stay tuned and we'll keep you posted."

Mr. Paul – "I have one item your Honor. I'd like to adopt a resolution as Council as a whole supporting the Issue 1 & 2 which is a tax renewal for the City of Steubenville. Issue 1 is a 7/10 the other one is a 3/10 it figures out to a penny. It's very helpful in helping us run the city. I have everything right here. I know Mr. Mastros has some of this stuff but I would like to have a resolution up next week in support of Issues 1 & 2 the renewal levy for the City of Steubenville." Second by Mr. Villamagna. "Thank you. If there is anything else here's all the money and how it's allocated you know that. You can probably get it off Mike Dolak he has the most up to date facts that we need but I would do that and I'd like to do that before I think the ballots will come out April 6<sup>th</sup> where you can mail in your ballot and we're working on something and if anybody would like to come to me we have a meeting at 12:00 Friday over at the Fort. It's not on City property it's at the Fort and discussing ways to campaign for this Issue 1 & 2 levy renewal. It's a renewal. It's nothing new just a renewal. Alright thank you."

Mr. Petrella – "Your Honor I just have one comment and Mr. Paul touched upon it; it's Issues 1 & 2 there are two separate issues and they both have to be voted on separately and hopefully they'll both be voted yes. Vote yes on 1 and vote yes on 2 and that's one thing that I think we really as a Council need to empathize that they are two separate issues and they need to be both voted on separately for passage."

Mrs. Hahn – "I just want to add one additional thing because I think when we're talking about all this money to the City people may think well why would I want to vote for a levy renewal when all this money is coming to the city but these are really two different projects so to speak. In other words the 7/10 money is going to support our infrastructure with roads and we make plans five years out. We work with grants to stretch our dollars we're going to have it on a flier so you can see how much your tax dollars have gone toward in fixing the conditions of our streets. And then the 3/10 money is the capital funding for the Parks and Recreation there may be something in Parks and Recreation that we can do with the additional funds that are coming from the rescue plan but the 3/10 money is so they can plan ahead for the 13 parks we have and how we can continue to make capital improvements. So I just want people to understand it's one thing if we're able to do water infrastructure and we'll discuss whether or not we can put on hold the increases or whatever we're going to do but please

don't think that because we're getting this influx of money we don't need to really be good stewards over the capital plans that we have for streets and for parks and recreation. But we can say more about it next week."

Mayor Barilla – "I think 3/10 goes to support wages."

Mr. Paul – "Wages. 85% is wages. 15% is street improvements."

Mrs. Hahn – "Okay I'm sorry."

Mr. Paul – "That's okay."

Mayor Barilla – "Yeah 15% goes to..."

Mrs. Hahn – "Parks and Recreation."

Mayor Barilla – "No to streets. The 7/10 is for Parks and Recreation. That's a \$100,000 for that department."

Mrs. Hahn – "Okay maybe next week (all inaudible)."

Mr. Petrella – "Your Honor I want to comment on what Mrs. Hahn said earlier about the money that Bob mentioned was that this is not to go for our budget. Not to think that this extra money is going to take care of the budget. 3/10 and the 7/10 support our budget on an annual basis."

Mayor Barilla – "Right now that money from the Government the preliminary shows for the water, wastewater, and board band those are the three main topics in that legislation but compare the things broken down as it comes along those are the three main topics water, wastewater and board band. Not for wages. But we'll see."

Mr. Petrella – "Not to keep going on but the water and wastewater are enterprise funds and the 3/10 and the 7/10 supports the general fund."

### **REPORT OF ADMINISTRATIVE OFFICERS**

Mr. Mavromatis – "Thank you Mayor. We have an award that was given out for Murphy and Northend Field to put in fitness centers and the low bidder on this was Sofor Construction of 58305 Sandy Ridge Rd. Barnesville, Ohio and that's for both of those two parks so they won the bid on that. We have for street resurfacing of the CDBG funding NLS Paving Inc. of St. Clairsville was the lowest bid and they have been awarded the contract for several of our streets here in the city. Tonight Dr. Macedonia was reappointed to the board of the Jefferson County Health Department Board and it was a close vote. Again we went into executive session and came out and the vote was (inaudible) so he's been reappointed to the Jefferson County Health Board. I was on that call today with Mrs. Hahn, Dave Lewis and Jerry Barilla as fix the fashion with the Federal Government everyone is waiting for the specific guidance from the Department of Treasury. They specifically made it clear the next 60 to 90 days that the money is to be dispersed. Our money will be coming through the State that's the pass through is through the State and then on to the City here. They clearly talk about a plan being in place which is not of any difficulty this is just making sure that the cities are following the guidelines on how this money is supposed to be spent and as the Mayor has said and I apologize Mrs. Hahn I was not here for your comments but again we were all there and heard the same things. In the next 24 hours we are supposed to receive a PDF of the bill of the bullets that were taken from the bill to show exactly where this money should be going so and I say in the next few weeks we'll probably be getting more guidance here because everybody in the United States as several times comments were made by the participants Lacy Bearsley, Jen Gregory, and Clarence Anthony from NLC in their lifetimes they have never seen the amount of money that has been put out to the cities, counties, and states throughout our country so this is clearly being earmarked to help these cities and counties and states for what they've gone through with the pandemics and they clearly want to try to address the issues that every city in this country has been facing."

Mr. Villamagna – "Jim you were a little bit late so I had asked Council what me and you had talked about."

Mr. Mavromatis – "Yes."

Mr. Villamagna – "When this is all; all the rules are in place; Dave Lewis and get all the department heads and have a special Council Meeting."

Mr. Mavromatis – "Absolutely."

Mr. Villamagna – "To discuss that and nothing else."

Mr. Mavromatis – "I will tell you this what we have went through with the Cares Act money saved us is a lot of areas and the due diligence especially from our attorney here what we had to do to justify our expenditures and consultation with our auditors worked out well for this city and again I'll be the first one to tell you being able to receive this amount of money and look at the infrastructure issues that we face here will hopefully get us to where we need to be and again I'm hoping even down the road they'll be additional funds coming so that's all I have to report."

Mayor Barilla – "Mr. Mavromatis do you want to mention the timeline as to when this money has to be spent."

Mr. Mavromatis – "Yes I apologize Mayor you're absolutely correct. It's quite interesting the date that they gave here and he repeated it twice and I made sure I wrote it down this money has to be spent by December 31, 2024. Now we also said we're looking at the next 60 to 90 days you can probably tack on another 120 days by the time the Government gets this out and gets the policies that need to go with it. But the bottom line is I think that's (inaudible) time for everybody to do what they have to do with this funding. Thank you sir."

Mr. Mastros – No Report

### **MISCELLANEOUS REPORTS**

Mayor Barilla – “We’ll now move onto miscellaneous reports and signing in this evening we have Mr. Timmons.”

Mr. Timmons – “Yes thank you Mayor. First I just wanted to recognize Tariq Wilson after the last weekend he placed third in the nation at the NCAA Division I Wrestling National Championships. I am working on finding out when he will be in town and then I’d like to sunshine a resolution at that time to honor him. We did that a couple years ago and he wasn’t able to make it so I would like to have him in person this time. Now I also want to sunshine a resolution honoring Franciscan University’s Men’s Cross Country team they have recently won the first PAC Conference Championship for the school in any sport. They do have one Steubenville native on the team and also an Assistant Grad Coach they also have so they will be coming down next week to get the resolution so that’s all I have.” Second by Mr. Petrella.

Mayor Barilla – “Just a side note that the plaque honoring Dolores Wiggins has been shipped so hopefully we’ll get that for sure next week and we’ll bring it to Council so that all can see it and we can place it in the hallway.”

Mrs. Hahn – “Can I ask when we’re going to do that with Yonk because we’ve have been waiting quite a while.”

Mayor Barilla – “Yeah I was told by his sister today that he was out of the hospital. He’s under weather so the plaque that you had made I’ve had a little bit of difficulty getting holes drilled into it because of what it is made of. We were thinking about putting a bracket around it and mount it that way. Then we’re also working on the plaque for Mayor Mucci.
